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This pattern can be worked from start to finish without having to tie and cut if a split chain is used. Finished size in No. 20 approximately 2".
Skills Required: A knowledge of Split Rings, Self Closing Mock Ring and Split Chain (optional) are needed.

## Abbreviations



Note: for those who prefer front side/back side tatting the text in italics and red indicates where the worker needs to use the second half of the ds first.

Materials - Size 20 thread, two shuttles, size 11 seed beads plus one large bead (size doesn't matter). Add 4 small, 1 large, 4 small beads to ball thread and wind $21 / 2$ yards onto shuttle 1 . Pull off a further 3 yards and wind onto shuttle 2. Before starting make sure all the beads are wound on shuttle 2. Another 9 beads are needed to add to picots.
