
Making a Downwards Facing Picot With or Without a Bead – Jane Eborall 2006 Amended in 2017

The downward facing picot is very simple to make.

It consists of two first half of a ds followed by a picot and then two second half of a ds. If using a bead then replace the picot with the bead. - see below

After working the pattern to the point where the picot is required work two half doubles, picot then two second half doubles. Continue the pattern.



Often notated as seta, picot, setb. There are several ways of notating the down picot.

Often a bead will be required in a down picot so this is moved into place after the two first half doubles.

This could be notated as seta, B, setb but other notation can be used.

Once the work is snugged up the picot (with or without the bead) will drop into the centre of the work.
