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Instead of snoozing in front of the television on Christmas Day I decided to tat a handkerchief edging! This is the result. A simple but fairly wide edging which, when worked in a size 80 thread, measures almost  $\frac{3}{4}$ ". Any size thread can be used but I prefer an 80 for handkerchiefs.

R1: 3 - 3 - 3 - 4 - 4 Cl RW

Ch: 6 - 6 RW

\*R2: 6 + (last p prev R) 6 Cl

SR3: 3 - 3 / 3 - 3 Cl RW

Ch: 3 - 3 RW

SR4: 3 + (SR3) 3 / 3 - 3 Cl

R5: 6 + (same p on R1) 6 Cl RW

Ch: 6 - 6 Lj (next p R1) SLT RW

Ch: 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 SLT

R6: 3 - 3 - 3 - 4 - 4 Cl RW

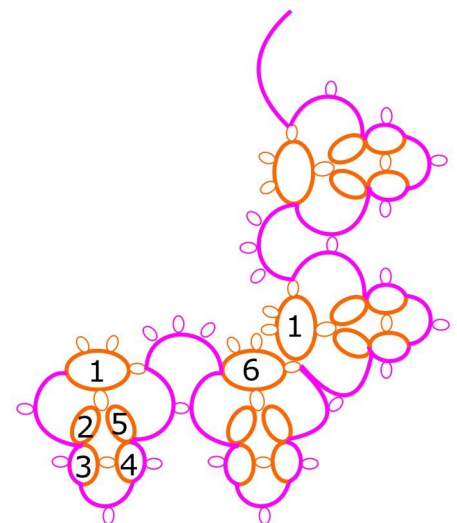
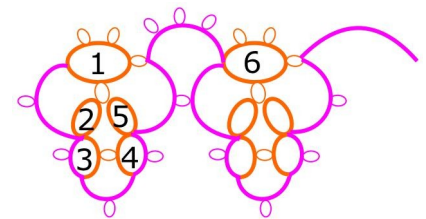
Ch: 6 + (p on last but one Ch) 6 RW

Repeat from \* until length required finishing after the chain following R5 but do not SLT

### Corner

R1: 3 - 3 - 3 - 4 - 4 Cl RW

Ch: 6 + (p on last Ch) 6 RW continue from R2 of side
