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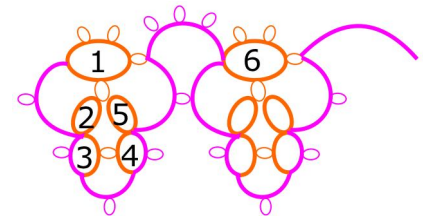
Instead of snoozing in front of the television on Christmas Day I decided to tat a handkerchief edging! This is the result. A simple but fairly wide edging which, when worked in a size 80 thread, measures almost ¾". Any size thread can be used but I prefer an 80 for handkerchiefs.

Abbreviations

R	ring	Ch	chain
SR	Split ring	Cl	Close
RW	Reverse work	SLT	Shoe lace trick
p	picot	- or p	Picot
+	join	prev	previous

Edge

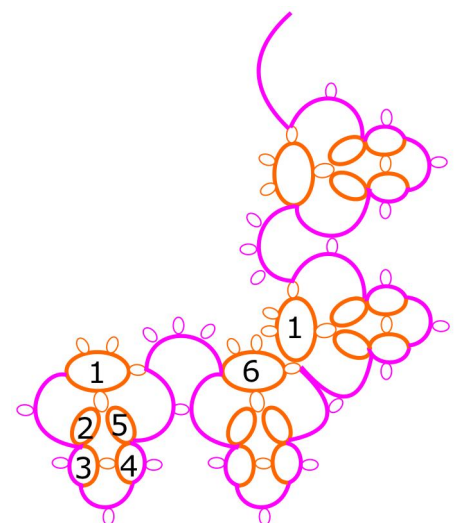
- R1: 3 – 3 – 3 – 4 – 4 Cl RW
- Ch: 6 – 6 RW
- *R2: 6 + (last p prev R) 6 Cl
- SR3: 3 – 3 / 3 – 3 Cl RW
- Ch: 3 – 3 RW
- SR4: 3 + (SR3) 3 / 3 – 3 Cl
- R5: 6 + (same p on R1) 6 Cl RW
- Ch: 6 – 6 Lj (next p R1) SLT RW
- Ch: 3 – 3 – 3 – 3 SLT
- R6: 3 – 3 – 3 – 4 – 4 Cl RW
- Ch: 6 + (p on last but one Ch) 6 RW



Repeat from * until length required finishing after the chain following R5 but do not SLT

Corner

- R1: 3 – 3 – 3 – 4 – 4 Cl RW
- Ch: 6 + (p on last Ch) 6 RW continue from R2 of side
