

The fairy can be made in any thread. If made in a no. 20 she measures $23 / 4$ ".
Skills Required: Knowledge of split rings, Continuous Thread Join (illustrated below)

## Abbreviations

| R | ring | Ch | chain |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| - or $p$ | picot | SR | split ring |
| $/$ | after the / make 2nd half of SR | B | move bead in place of p |
| SS | Switch shuttles | vsp | very small picot (smallest you can make) |
| Sh1 | Shuttle 1 (shuttle in right hand) | Lj | join made with shuttle thread |
| S | start | + | join |
| T\&C | Tie and cut | (1 fl 1 ufl) | 1 flipped ds followed by one unflipped ds (as in <br> second side SR) |
| CTJ | Continuous Thread Join (see below) |  |  |


| Making the CTJ - continuous thread join |
| :--- |
| Using a hook, take Sh1 thread under and up <br> through the last very small picot of SR10. Push <br> Sh2 through the loop and gently tighten. |

NB. The wand is made by making one regular double stitch followed by an unflipped double stitch as in the second side of a split ring.

## Plain Fairy

Head - 2 shuttles \& 1 bead on Sh1. Keep bead on shuttle until required.
R1: 1 vsp 3 ( $-1 \times 14$ graduated from $3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ ) 4 B 5
Body
SR2: 8 vsp 4 vsp 2 vsp 2 / 1 + (vsp R1) 3 vsp 10
Skirt
SR3: 2 / 4 vsp 2
SR4: 2 + (next vsp SR2) 2 / 2 vsp 2
SR5: 2 + (next vsp SR2) 4 / 2
SR6: 10 vsp 4 / 3
SR7: 2 vsp $2 / 4$
SR8: 2 vsp $2 / 2+(v s p$ SR4) 2
SR9: 2 vsp 2 / 4
SR10: $4 / 3+(S R 3) 3 \operatorname{vsp}(2 \operatorname{vsp} \times 3) 2$


Ch: $\quad$ vsp 5 Lj (SR9) vsp 4 Lj (SR8) vsp 4 Lj (SR7) vsp 5 Lj (SR6) SS
Ch: $1(-1 \times 6)$ Lj (vsp below SR7) $1(-1 \times 2)$ vsp 1 Lj (vsp below SR8) $-1 \mathrm{vsp} 1(-1 \times 2) \mathrm{Lj}$ (vsp below SR9) $1(-1 \times 6)$ Lj (vsp below SR10) CTJ to vsp's on SR10) Continue to wing Wing

Ch: 8 vsp 2 SS
SR11: 2 + (vsp on Ch) 2 vsp $2 / 2$ Rw
Ch: 4 Lj (vsp SR13) SS 30 Lj (vsp SR2 on back of body) SS Continue to arm taking both shuttles to the front of the body.

## Arm

SR12: 4 / 4
SR13: 4 / 4
SR14: $2+$ (vsp SR2 on front of body) 1 vsp $1 / 3$
SR15: 1 + (vsp SR14) 2 vsp $1 / 3$
SR16: 1 + (vsp SR15) $1 / 6$ Continue to wand

## Wand

Ch: ( 1 fl 1 ufl$) \times 5$
SR17: 1-1-1/1-1-1 Tie a knot and cut leaving ends as 'sparkles'. Cut other four picots on wand.

## Legs

SR1: 3 vsp $1 / 3$ vsp 1
SR2: $1+(v s p$ SR1) 2 vsp $1 / 1+(v s p$ SR1) 3
SR3: $1+(v s p$ SR2) 1 vsp $1 / 4$
SR4: $1+(v s p$ SR3) 2 vsp $1 / 2$ vsp 1 vsp 1
SR5: $1+(\operatorname{vsp}$ SR4) $1+(v s p$ Ch btwn SR9 \& SR8 on skirt) $1 / 1+(v s p$ SR5) 1
SR6: $1+($ vsp next Ch on skirt) 2 vsp $1 / 1$ vsp 1
SR7: $1+(v s p$ SR6) 2 vsp $1 / 1+(v s p$ SR6) $1+(v s p$ SR4) 1 vsp 1
SR8: $1+(v s p$ SR7) 2 vsp $1 / 1+(v s p$ SR7) 2 vsp 1
SR9: $1+(v s p$ SR8) 2 vsp $1 / 1+(v s p$ SR8) 2 vsp 1
R10: $1+(v s p$ SR9) $3 / 1+(v s p$ SR9) 3

## Beaded Fairy

Add 33 beads to Sh1 followed by 1 bead for the eye.
Work as for un-beaded version until first chain after SR10 has been worked. This takes you back to SR6. Then SS.

## Skirt

Ch: 1 ( $\mathrm{B} 1 \times 6$ ) $\mathrm{Lj}(\mathrm{vsp}$ below SR7) 1 ( $\mathrm{B} 1 \times 2$ ) vsp 1 Lj (vsp below SR8) B 1 vsp 1 ( $\mathrm{B} 1 \times 2$ ) Lj (vsp below SR9) 1 (B $1 \times 6$ ) Lj (vsp below SR10) CTJ to vsp's on SR10) Continue to wing

## Wing

Ch: 2 B 2 B 2 B 2 vsp 2 SS
SR11: 2 + (vsp on Ch) 2 vsp $2 / 2$ Rw
Ch: 4 Lj (vsp SR11) SS 2 (B $2 \times 14$ ) 2 Lj (vsp SR2 on back of body) SS Continue to arm taking both shuttles to the front of the body.
Continue with arms and legs as before.
