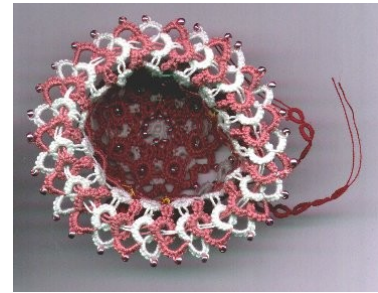


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The following hat pattern could be used to put pot pourri or lavender in. It could also be used for a doll's hat. I leave the rest to your imagination, but have fun with it! The pattern was first published in Tatting Times in May 2001. When worked in a No. 20 thread it measures 3" in diameter. The 'ribbon' and flowers are made in a No. 80 thread. The crown is made up of overlapping self closing mock rings and rings. The brim uses inter-linked rings.

**Abbreviations:**

SCMR	Self Closing Mock Ring	Wsh 1	working shuttle one	Wsh 2	working shuttle two
T & C	tie and cut	+B	add bead to picot before joining	SLT	shoe lace trick (tie knot!!)
Rw	reverse work	Wsh 1	Wsh 2		

**Crown:**

**Centre** using Wsh 2

R: 1 \* - 1 repeat from \* 7 times T & C

**Row 1**

Using Wsh 2 with white

SCMR: 4 - 4 (R 2 - 1 + B [p of centre row] 1 - 2 Cl) 4 - 4 Cl Rw

Ch: 4 - 4 See fig. 2

R: 4 - 4 + (3<sup>rd</sup> p of ring ON SCMR) 4 - 4 RW

Ch: 4 - 4 SLT See fig. 3

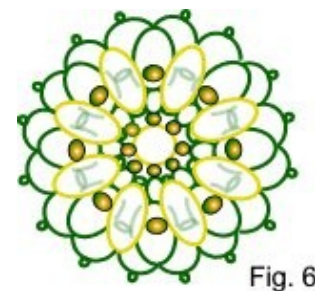
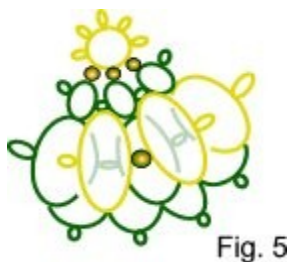
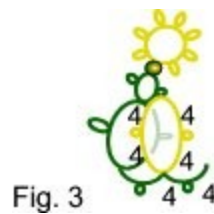
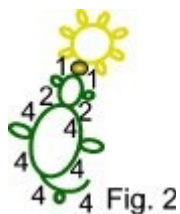
\*SCMR 4 + (p on last SCMR - joining BEHIND last R) 4 (R 2 + [3<sup>rd</sup> p on ring ON last SCMR] 1 + B [next p of centre row] 1 - 2 Cl ) 4 - 4 Cl RW SLT See fig. 4

Ch: 4 - 4 RW

R: 4 + B (in front of SCMR to last R) 4 + (p on ring ON last SCMR) 4 - 4 Rw

Ch: 4 - 4 Rw SLT. See fig. 4

Repeat from \* until 8 SCMR's and R's have been worked joining last SCMR to first and last R to first R with a bead. T & C **See figs. 5 & 6**



## Side of hat

**1<sup>st</sup> Row** - using Wsh 2 (white) and green for chains on ball

R: 4 - 4 + B (chain on crown) 4 - 4

Ch: 4 - 4

\*R: 4 + B (3<sup>rd</sup> p of last R) 4 + B (next chain on crown) 4 - 4

Ch :4 - 4 Repeat from \* joining last R to first ring with a bead. T & C

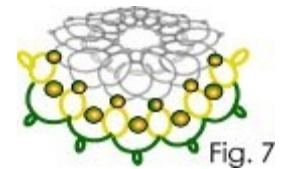

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Row

R: 3 - 3 - 3 - 3

Ch: 4 + (chain of last row) 4

\*R: 3 + (3<sup>rd</sup> p of last R) 3 - 3 - 3

Ch: 4 + (chain of last row) 4 Repeat from \* joining last R to first ring. T & C. See fig. 8

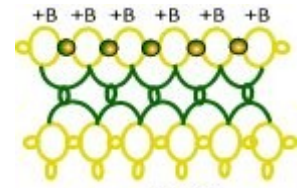

## Brim

2 shuttles as before. 16 beads threaded onto each shuttle. Using Wsh 2

SCMR: 4 - 4 (R 2 + joined p's of last row 2 Cl) 4 - 4 RW

Ch: 4 B 4 RW

R: 4 - 4 + (middle p on next ring of last row) 4 - 4 RW SLT

Ch: 4 B 4 RW Wsh 2

\*SCMR: 4 + (p of last SCMR bringing the p up through the middle of last R) 4 (R 2 + joined p's of last row 2 Cl) 4 - 4 RW SLT

Ch: 4 B 4 RW

R: 4 + (p on last R bringing it up through the middle of last SCMR) 4 + (middle p on next R of last row) 4 - 4 RW SLT Wsh 1

Ch: 4 B 4 RW Wsh 2

**Repeat from \* until you are ready to start the last SCMR.**

SCMR: 4 + (p of last SCMR as before) 4 (R 2 + joined p's of last row 2 Cl) 4 + (1<sup>st</sup> p of 1<sup>st</sup> SCMR of row) 4 RW SLT

Ch: 4 B 4 RW

Before starting the last ring, cut thread from Wsh 2 and take the end over, round the joined p's of the first and last SCMR's and up from behind. Wrap the thread round the hand ready to work the final ring usual. You will have to work on the loop formed at the **FRONT** of the joined p's. **See fig. 9**

R: 4 + (p on last R as before) 4 + (p on last row as usual) 4 next pull the whole ring to the back of the joined p's of the SCMR's and then + (p on 1<sup>st</sup> R bringing it **DOWN** through the centre of 1<sup>st</sup> SCMR) 4 RW SLT Wsh 1

Ch: 4 B 4 RW T & C

Make last ring at front here until you are ready to join to 1st ring. Then continue working the ring at the back of work

The band is attached to the chains, which join the two rows forming the side of the hat, and is made up of 36 split rings of 10 / 10. It is made using size 80 thread in a contrasting or matching colour according to taste.

The flowers are also worked in no. 80 thread and each have 5 beads The outer part of the flowers are made of five rings, leaving a long thread at the beginning and end to tie to the hat.

R: 8 - 4 B 4 - 8

R: 8 + (3<sup>rd</sup> p of last R) 4 B 4 - 8

Continue until five rings have been made, joining last to first ring. Centre is a ring of 15 doubles also leaving a thread at beginning and end to tie into the outer part and onto the hat.
