


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Materials 5 sequins - 2 1/4cm (7/8") diameter. Coats No. 20 thread

Abbreviations

picot Rnd round reverse work rw T & C tie and cut join



Large Motif

Rounds 1 & 2- two of these rounds are needed to go behind and in front of the sequin. See fig. 1

1 - 1 - 1R: *Ch: 2 - 2

 $1 + (2^{nd} p of last R) 1 - 1 Rep from * 8 times joining last ring to first.$ R: There should be 10 rings and 10 chains. T & C

Round 3 – this round joins round 1 and 2 so that they lie on top of each other. The sequin is slipped in between them just before completion. See fig. 2

6 - 3 - 3

*R2: $3 + (2^{nd} p of R1) 2 + (p's on rnds 1 and rnd 2) 2 - 3 R3: <math>3 + (3^{rd} p of last R) 3 - 6 rw$

Ch: 8 - 8 rw

R4: 3 + (2nd p of R3) 4 + (next upper and lower p's on rnds 1 & 2) 4 - 3 rw

8 - 8 Ch:

 $6 + (3^{rd} p R4) 3 - 3$ R5:

Repeat from * joining last R to first R. T & C. Fig. 3 shows a close up of round 3.





Small Motifs

The small motifs are made using rnds 1 & 2 only. The second round is joined to the 1st as it is worked and again the sequin is inserted just before the last ring is worked.
