HOME Pendant made with split rings - © Jane Eborall 2003







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A very simple pendant consisting of mainly beaded split rings with LOADS of beads. It is made up in three parts with as many split rings as you want. Each part (or 'spider') is

made up in three parts with as many split rings as you want. Each part (or spider) is made up as follows. Instructions given are for 7 split rings on each spider although more or less can obviously be used. Add 27 beads to each shuttle before starting each 'leg'. The first part includes the centre ring from which each leg radiates. A picture showing how to start a split ring without a knot is also shown below.

R1: 1 - 2 - 2 - 2 - 2 - 2 - 2 - 1 add in the second shuttle.

SR2 - SR7: 2 B 2 B 2 B 2 B 2 B 2 B 2 B 2 B 2 Move a bead along each thread to the base of this SR before starting the next one. After SR7 cut the shuttles off leaving long ends onto which other beads are added.

Each 'leg' of the 'spider' is added to a picot on R1 using the method shown in fig 2 to start. To assemble the pendant use beads and wire placing beads between each 'spider'.

The cord is made with the four shuttle split ring method but any cord or chain will suffice.
