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**Materials required:**– 2 shuttles wound with white thread. Small amount orange/yellow thread. 1 small bead on shuttle 1. The completed swan measures approx. 1 ¼" x 1 ¼".

**Skills required** – split rings, Victorian 'sets', ring on chain.

**Abbreviations**

R	ring	Ch	chain
- or p	picot	SR	split ring
/	after the / make 2nd half of SR	Rw	reverse work
+	join	SS	Switch shuttles
S	start	vsp	very small picot (smallest you can make)

**Starting at head** with shuttle 1 and leaving bead on core thread until required.

**Head**

R1: 4 vsp 2 move bead next to last ds 8 Cl SS

**Neck**

Ch: (seta setb) x 4 vsp (seta setb) x 3 SS

**Body**

SR2: 4 / 10 Cl

SR3: 8 Lp (¼") 2 / 6 Cl

SR4: 2 + (Lp SR3) 4 / Cl 6 Rw

Ch: 4 vsp 1 SS

RoCh: 1 + (vsp on last Ch) 4 Lp – 4 vsp 1 Cl SS

Ch: 1 + (vsp RoCh) 1 Rw

R5: 6 + (Lp R3) 6 Cl Rw

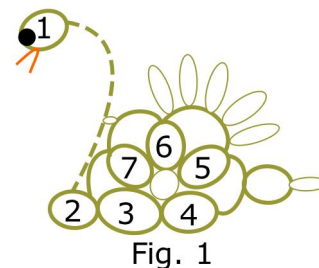
Ch: 2 – 2 – 2 – 2 – 2 – 2 Rw

R6: 6 + (Lp R3) 6 Cl Rw

Ch: 6 + (vsp on first Ch) 2 Rw

R7: 6 + (Lp R3) 6 Cl Rw

Ch: 8 + (space btwn SR2 & SR3) T & C



Add the yellow beak thread to the vsp on ring 1 – see below. Cut to form a beak.
