Ch: $4 + (vsp R12 \text{ on } 1^{st} \text{ section worked } - \text{ can you find it?!?!?}) 3 + (vsp R9 \text{ on section } 1) 4 + (vsp R5 \text{ on section } 1) 4 + (vsp R1 \text{ on section } 1) 3 Lj (Ch between R10 & R11) 4 Lj (vsp base R11) T & C$

Make sure all the VLP's on the neck are pulled to the front of the work (the rooster should be facing towards the right) and press. You can trim the tail feathers according to taste.
