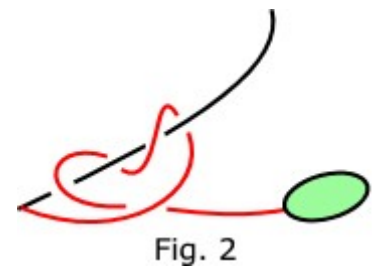


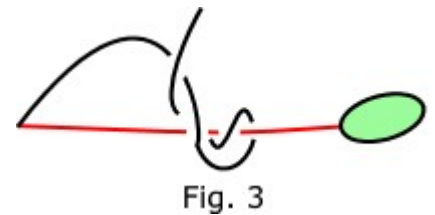
This idea was taken from one paragraph in Rhoda Auld's book – Tatting the Contemporary Art of Knotting with a Shuttle published in 1974. See pages 84 and 85. This knot can be used for either a ring or chain. The following drawings show a chain being worked.



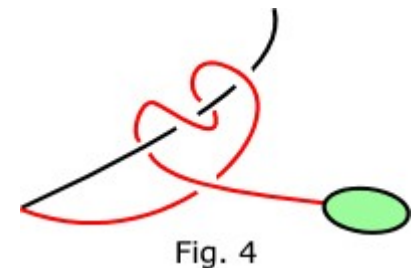
Form the first half of the double stitch as usual (fig. 1) then do the same move **again** round the core thread. See figs 1 & 2 below.



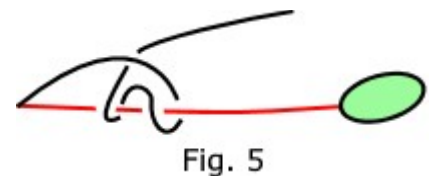
Turn the thread as usual (flip) to form the first part of the double, double stitch.



Make the second half of the double stitch as usual but again make the same move round the core thread.



Again turn the stitch as usual and now you have a double, double stitch.



A finished knot can be seen at the top of the page.
